

Today's Worship: THE SAVIOR'S SERMON - TRUST IN GOD'S STRENGTH

Jesus begins the Sermon on the Mount with a series of blessings. "Blessed are..." Jesus says, again and again. In the Latin translation of the Bible, these begin with the word "beati" which translates as "blessed" or "happy." Thus, this portion is often called "The Beatitudes." It had to give Jesus' listeners pause. For what Jesus calls blessed, the world never would. The world praises the strong and the self-sufficient. Jesus calls blessed what others would see as weak or stupid. But, like any good preacher, Jesus is trying to drive home one crucial point. The weaker you are, the more ready you are to rely on God's strength. The more difficult your present circumstances, the likelier you are to yearn for future reward.

from the Sovereign LORD comes escape from death.


Summon your power, God;

and have sinned against you in my thoughts, words, and actions.


I have not loved you with my whole heart;

But Jesus, my Savior, paid for my sins with his innocent suffering and death.


Trusting in him, I pray: God, have mercy on me, a sinner.




Prayer and The Lord's Prayer
