“Whatever is True; A Christian View of Anxiety” - Last Sunday we were blessed to have Bill Woodington in church presenting on the topic of God's Word and anxiety. Through his own personal experience with anxiety, Bill helped us consider the comfort, power and practical implications God's Word provides for those who struggle with anxiety. Bill is the author of the book "Whatever is True; a Christian View of Anxiety". Griefshare – Beginning Monday, February 6 @ 6pm. GriefShare is a ministry to help people who are grieving the loss of a loved one who has died – recently or in the past. We meet for about 2 hours each week; to watch a short video hosted by mental health experts and people who have gone through the grieving process themselves; we take time to discuss the video, though sharing is not required; and between each session there is a workbook with daily exercises that point you to God's Word and help you work through your grief. We'll be meeting in the social hall of our church each Monday evening from 6-8pm.
