Today's Worship: GOD IN THREE PERSON'S, BLESSED TRINITY

In the first half of the Church Year (Advent through Pentecost) we look at the life of Christ—his birth, ministry, death, resurrection, ascension, and the sending of the Holy Spirit. In the second half of the year, we look at the teachings of Christ. We begin by looking at one of the most mind-blowing truths: that God is triune.

Already in the very first chapter of the Bible we read, "Then God said, "Let us make mankind in our image..." (Genesis 1:26). Note the singular "God" and the plural "us." Scripture teaches us that there is only one God but that he exists as three persons—Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. He is triune (three-in-one). This teaching is not some logical exercise or philosophical excursion. The doctrine of the Trinity is central to our salvation. The triune God is our Creator, Redeemer, and Sanctifier. Lose this doctrine, and as the Athanasian Creed says, you lose it all. A Jesus who is less than God is also less than a Savior.

So often, when life gets hard, we get frustrated. We don't understand how God is working always for our good. But the doctrine of the Trinity teaches us we cannot even comprehend God's existence. How then, could we ever comprehend all his workings? On this Holy Trinity Sunday, let it be enough to know that all three persons—Father, Son, and Spirit—love us with an everlasting love.

(we pray) - Surely, O God, we have no power to defend ourselves. It is only to you that we can turn for protection from all physical and spiritual danger – from the things that may hurt our bodies, and more importantly, those that will hurt our souls. But it's our own sin that harms us the most. Today we confess the depths of our depravity to you... Merciful God, from my very beginning I am a lost creature. My sin is proof of my guilt and therefore I have no right to claim a place in your family.

I do not deserve to be called your child but your enemy. Yet, you promise mercy and forgiveness to me through your Son, Jesus. Have mercy on me according to your unfailing love.

Cleanse me from my sin, and take away my guilt.

Dear believers, your heavenly Father has FORGIVEN all your sins. Jesus' perfect life and innocent death is the proof that he has removed your guilt forever. You are not his enemy but his own dear children. May our loving God give you joy to do his will!

It is our God who has saved us – we will trust in him without any fear – Amen!



Message Notes: Things for me to remember this week

Our Confession of the Triune God

ATHANASIAN CREED: Select portions for Trinity Sunday This creed is named for St. Athanasius, a staunch defender of the Christian faith in the fourth century A.D. It was written to combat two errors that undermined the Bible's clear teaching: One error denied that God's Son and the Holy Spirit are of one being with the Father. The other error denied that Jesus is true God and man in one person. The wording of the Creed strikes some as harsh. The Creed isn't condemning those who are still growing in their faith (for example, our children or new Christians), but reminds us that no one can reject what the Bible teaches without losing the salvation God gives.

Whoever wishes to be saved must, above all else, hold to the true Christian faith. Now this is the true Christian faith:

We worship one God in three persons and three persons in one God, Without mixing the persons or dividing the divine being.

For each person—the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit—is distinct, but the deity of Father, Son, and Holy Spirit is one, equal in glory and coeternal in majesty.

What the Father is, so is the Son, and so is the Holy Spirit.

The Father is uncreated, the Son uncreated, the Holy Spirit uncreated;

The Father is infinite, the Son infinite, the Holy Spirit infinite; The

Father is eternal, the Son eternal, the Holy Spirit eternal;

yet they are not three who are eternal, but there is one who is eternal,

just as they are not three who are uncreated, nor three who are infinite, but there is one who is uncreated and one who is infinite.

In the same way the Father is almighty, the Son is almighty, the Holy Spirit is almighty; yet they are not three who are almighty, but there is one who is almighty.

So the Father is God, the Son is God, the Holy Spirit is God; yet they are not three Gods, but one God.

So the Father is Lord, the Son is Lord, the Holy Spirit is Lord; yet they are not three Lords, but one Lord.

For just as Christian truth compels us to confess each person individually to be God & Lord, so the true Christian faith forbids us to speak of three Gods or three Lords.

The Father is neither made nor created nor begotten of anyone. The Son is neither made nor created, but is begotten of the Father alone. The Holy Spirit is neither made nor created nor begotten, but proceeds from the Father and the Son.

So there is one Father, not three Fathers; one Son, not three Sons; one Holy Spirit, not three Holy Spirits.

And within this Trinity none comes before or after; none is greater or inferior, **But all three persons are coequal and coeternal**,

so that, in every way, as stated before, all three persons are to be worshipped as one God and one God worshipped as three persons.

Whoever wishes to be saved must have this conviction of the Trinity.




Be seated
