The truth we celebrate today has the highest importance for all of our lives. God says the meaning of Easter is simply this:

- + Jesus Christ's resurrection from the dead is God's proof to us that he has accepted Jesus'
  - life and death as payment for our sins. We are freely forgiven because of Jesus.
- + Jesus Christ's resurrection gives us new purpose as we live to glorify God.
- + Jesus Christ's resurrection assures us that God will one day raise us from the dead to live before him in a perfect world.
- + Jesus Christ's resurrection is God's proof that the Christian faith is the true faith that he
  - wants all people to know and believe.

# Opening Easter Praise: Jesus Christ Is Risen Today

Christ is risen!

He is risen indeed!

I know that my redeemer lives, and that in the end he will stand on the earth.

Because Jesus lives and in the end will stand, we can withstand all that causes *doubt*. God raised Jesus from the dead just as he had promised. The resurrection demonstrates that every claim Jesus made about himself is true and every promise Jesus has made to us will be kept.

This is the gospel we have received. On this gospel we take our stand. By this gospel we are saved.

Because Jesus lives and in the end will stand, we can withstand all that causes *guilt*. Were we responsible for paying for our sins, our work would be endless and pointless. But when Jesus had offered for all time one sacrifice for sins, he sat down at God's right hand to wait for his enemies to be made his footstool. He has made perfect forever those who belong to him.

Christ Jesus who died-more than that, who was raised to life-is at the right hand of God and is also interceding for us.

Because Jesus lives and in the end will stand, we can withstand all that causes *despair*. Though life is full of trouble and sorrow, nothing can separate us from the love of Christ. We are more than conquerors through him who loved us. In him, all things must serve for our good.


God has placed all things under his feet and appointed him to be head over everything for the church.

from all the earth.


The LORD has spoken.




The Easter Gospel

Luke 24:1–12

'On the first day of the week, very early in the morning, the women took the spices they had prepared and went to the tomb. <sup>2</sup>They found the stone rolled away from the tomb, <sup>3</sup>but when they entered, they did not find the body of the Lord Jesus. <sup>4</sup>While they were wondering about this, suddenly two men in clothes that gleamed like lightning stood beside them. <sup>5</sup>In their fright the women bowed down with their faces to the ground, but the men said to them, "Why do you look for the living among the dead? <sup>6</sup>He is not here; he has risen! Remember how he told you, while he was still with you in Galilee: <sup>7</sup>The Son of Man must be delivered over to the hands of sinners, be crucified and on the third day be raised again." <sup>8</sup>Then they remembered his words.

<sup>9</sup>When they came back from the tomb, they told all these things to the Eleven and to all the others. <sup>10</sup>It was Mary Magdalene, Joanna, Mary the mother of James, and the others with them who told this to the apostles. <sup>11</sup>But they did not believe the women, because their words seemed to them like nonsense. <sup>12</sup>Peter, however, got up and ran to the tomb. Bending over, he saw the strips of linen lying by themselves, and he went away, wondering to himself what had happened.
